


The Gospel Coalition Women's Conference Update - TGCW22

Women from Erieside Church traveled to Indianapolis last Thursday to attend The Gospel Coalition Conference for Women for 2022 over the weekend. We thank God for their safe travels there and back and for the learnings they brought back with them and now share with others.

Here are the updates and highlights from Brandy Boggs:

Although it is difficult to briefly summarize all we enjoyed during our time at TGCW22, it was certainly a wonderful time of fellowship & encouragement from each other and through God's word.

The primary focus of the conference was **'Remember Your Joy'** as the speakers connected Old Testament stories to show the foreshadowing & promises that pointed to the fulfillment of them in Jesus.

A few takeaways from our time include:

- Recognizing our present joy is rooted in past reality and future hope;
- Knowing our salvation cannot be taken from us;
- We need to remember the reality of God and that nothing is too hard for Him.

I truly appreciate the in-depth understanding and study of stories we often learn as children but don't dig into deeper. As with David & Goliath, may we be like David and realize God's greatness, remember God's faithfulness, and represent God's kingdom. We will become what we behold. **Are we truly seeking to abide in Christ?**

I know some of the teaching is available online through the tgc.com website and I would recommend listening to it. Also I would highly recommend considering going to TGC or TGCW if you ever have the chance. You will not regret it.
